RESOLUTION NO. 2764

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A REFERENDUM ELECTION
ON THE QUESTION OF PROPERTY TAXES TO PAY FOR FUTURE STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

WHEREAS, § 10-3 of the City of St. Francis Code of Ordinances (the “Code”) establishes a system for the apportionment of the cost for paving streets, alleys and sidewalks in the City; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of § 10-3 of the Code, the costs of street improvement projects in the City are currently collected by means of special assessments to property owners; and

WHEREAS, from time-to-time, the Common Council has received comments from City residents concerning the financial impact to them resulting from the use of special assessments for street improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council desires to obtain input from the electors by means of an advisory referendum on the question of whether the City of St. Francis should increase real property taxes in order to reduce the use of special assessments to pay costs of future street improvement projects;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of St. Francis as follows:

Section 1. Referendum Election Date. The City Clerk/Treasurer is hereby directed to call an advisory referendum election to be held in the City at the regularly scheduled election to be held on November 6, 2018 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City the proposition of whether the City of St. Francis should increase property taxes in order to reduce the City’s use of special assessments to pay for costs of future street improvement projects.

Section 2. Notice to Electors. The City Clerk/Treasurer is directed to give notice by:

(a) Causing a Notice of Referendum in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A to be published in the Southshore NOW Published on the 4th Tuesday preceding the primary or election at which the referendum will appear provided, however, that if a weekly paper is used for publication, the notice is to be published in the closest issue preceding the 4th Tuesday before the referendum election.

(b) Causing an Instructions to Electors and Sample Ballot Notice in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit B to be published in the Southshore NOW the day before the election, or if a weekly paper is used, in the closest preceding issue. The Exhibit B Notice shall also be posted at the polling place on election day along with two sample ballots.

(c) Causing a Notice of Referendum in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C to be published in the Southshore NOW in the closest issue published immediately preceding the referendum election. This Exhibit C Notice shall also be posted in each polling place on election day.

(d) Causing a Notice of Hours and Locations of Polling Places in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit D to be published in the Southshore NOW in the closest issue preceding the election. This Exhibit D notice shall also be posted at the polling places on election day.

(e) Causing a Notice of Absentee Voting, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit E to be published in the Southshore NOW in the closest issue preceding the 4th Tuesday preceding the election.

Section 3. Polling Places and Hours. The City electors must vote at the referendum election at the times and polling places at which they cast their ballots in regularly scheduled elections.

Section 4. Referendum Election Officials. The election officials appointed for the City shall conduct the election.

Section 5. Official Referendum Ballot Form. The ballot to be used at the referendum election shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of Sections 5.64(2) and 7.08(1)(a), Wisconsin Statutes. The ballot shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit F.

The City Clerk/Treasurer shall cause to be printed sufficient ballots for use at said referendum election, both as actual ballots in those polling places which do not use voting machines and as absentee ballots where voting machines are used and as specimen ballots (the latter to be of a different and easily identifiable color from the actual ballot). The form of the ballot shall be filed with the official responsible for providing the ballots for the election, and the City Clerk/Treasurer shall file a copy of the ballot with the clerk of each county having territory within the City, as soon as possible after the date hereof but in no event later than 70 days prior to the election, as provided in Section 8.37, Wisconsin Statutes. Ballots should be delivered to the City Clerk/Treasurer at least 52 days prior to the election, to allow the municipal clerks to comply with their obligation to provide absentee ballots under Section 7.15, Wisconsin Statutes.

The City Clerk/Treasurer shall receive applications for absentee ballots and initial the same when issued to qualified absentee voters.

Section 6. Canvass. The returns of the referendum election shall be canvassed by the Board of Canvassers of the City of St. Francis. The Board of Canvassers shall certify the returns of the referendum election to the Common Council. Board of Canvassers shall meet in open session no later than 9:00 a.m. on the Tuesday after the election to determine the result of the referendum election. The canvass shall be open to the public and the City Clerk/Treasurer is directed to give due notice of said meeting.

TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS:

Notice is hereby given of an advisory referendum election to be held in the City of St. Francis, on November 6, 2018 at which the question(s), to be submitted to a vote for an advisory referendum, is shown in the sample ballot below.

INFORMATION TO VOTERS

Upon entering the polling place, a voter shall state his or her name and address, show an acceptable form of photo identification and sign the poll book before being permitted to vote. If a voter is not registered to vote, a voter may register to vote at the polling place serving his or her residence if the voter provides proof of residence in a form specified by law. Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall retire alone to a voting booth or machine and cast his or her ballot except that a voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Where Paper Ballots are Used

The voter shall make a mark **(X)** in the square next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall make a mark **(X)** in the square next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using a *tactile ballot marking device (Vote-PAD)* to mark a **paper** ballot, the voter shall obtain from the inspectors, the assistive device and any audio or dexterity aids if required. The voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question.

Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device ("Automark," "ExpressVote," or "ImageCast Evolution-ICE")* to mark an **optical scan** ballot, the voter shall touch the screen or use the

keypad to select "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen or use the keypad to select "no" if opposed to the question.

Where Touch Screen Voting is Used

The voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question.

The vote should not be cast in any other manner. Not more than five minutes' time shall be allowed inside a voting booth. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in casting his or her vote may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone in a manner that would reveal how the ballot is marked.

If a voter spoils a **paper or optical scan** ballot, he or she shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

A voter may spoil a **touch screen** ballot at the voting station before the ballot is cast.

After Marking the Ballot

After an official **paper** ballot is marked, it shall be folded so the inside marks do not show, but so the printed endorsements and inspectors' initials on the outside do show. The voter shall then deposit the ballot in the ballot box or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit, and shall leave the polling place promptly.

After an official **optical scan ballot** is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve so the marks do not show. The voter shall then insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. If a central count system is used, the voter shall insert the ballot in the ballot box and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

After an official **touch screen** ballot is marked, the voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing or understanding English or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, at an election to be held in the City of St. Francis on November 6, 2018, the following question will be submitted to a vote of the people of City Francis, on an advisory basis, concerning the method by which future street improvement projects should be paid for in the City of St. Francis.

The question will appear on the ballot as follows:

“Street Improvement Costs. Should the City of St. Francis increase property taxes in order to reduce the use of special assessments to pay costs of future street improvement projects?”

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT AND EFFECT OF VOTE

The referendum election ballot will ask City electors to vote "yes" or "no" on the advisory referendum election question as set forth above.

A "yes" vote on the question is in favor of increasing property taxes to reduce the use of special assessments to pay costs of future street improvement projects.

A "no" vote on the question is opposed to increasing property taxes to reduce the use of special assessments to pay for costs of future street improvement projects.

The effect of the vote is advisory in nature. In the event a majority of the electors voting vote "yes" on the question set forth above, the Common Council will consider that to mean that a majority of the electors favor an increased use of property taxes to pay for future street improvement projects in the City. If the majority of electors voting vote “no” on the question set forth above, the Common Council will consider that to mean that a majority of the electors favor continuing the existing policy of primarily using special assessments to pay for future street improvement projects in the City.

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

CITY OF ST. FRANCIS

November 6, 2018

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their municipal clerk. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing or online at MyVote.wi.gov.

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter or you may apply for an absentee ballot online at MyVote.wi.gov. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application to your municipal clerk for an absentee ballot in person, by mail, by fax, by email or at MyVote.wi.gov.

Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is:

5 pm on the fifth day before the election (November 1, 2018).

Note: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Voting an absentee ballot in person

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.
