The Concord Group (TCG) has prepared this Amendment to the Agreement to provide written documentation for the extra services that will be performed on the above-referenced project. The following information describes the additional scope of services, project schedule, fees, and the terms and conditions associated with this Amendment No. 1.

I. Scope of Additional Services

Adjustment to the scope of services are as follows:

The project has resulted in extra effort to be performed by TCG on the original estimated proposal to provide the initial Due Diligence, Construction Cost Validation, and Observation Monitoring for the project. The accrued services invoiced to date through October 31, 2019 has totaled \$83,372.40, which is the approximate total base fee of the original contract (\$83,440). In addition, the construction period will be extended requiring added observation services beyond the original date of substantial completion proposed for December 31, 2019 to a new end date anticipated in the Spring, 2020. Bear/CMA will be updating the dates of Substantial Completion/Occupancy in accordance with the Developer's Agreement.

However, the project appears to be nearly 30 days behind schedule currently as of today and with the recent weather issues we anticipate that the project will not likely achieve occupancy on the last two Buildings 10 and 11 until March 31, 2019. In addition, Bear/CMA will be completing installation of a "sacrificial asphalt base course" that will be totally replaced in the Spring when appropriate weather conditions will then allow for final paving operations to be completed. Therefore, we anticipate TCG's services for the Site Observation Monitoring phase will be extended to March 31, 2020 and the Project Close-out phase (which the service has not been performed yet, but fee for has been used) will be completed approximately April 15, 2020.

II. Project Schedule

TCG estimates conservatively that the above scope of services associated with Site Observation / Monthly Reporting and Project Close-out phases will be completed by March 31, 2020 and April 15, 2020, respectively.

III. Project Fees

The additional services described above will be completed for a Time and Expense fee basis estimated to total approximately \$29,350, broken down as follows:

Phase II – Site Observation/Monthly Reporting \$23,750 (approx. \$4,750/month average over 5 months)

Phase III – Project Close-out \$5,600

Total Estimated Amendment No. 1 Fee \$29,350

The terms and conditions associated with Amendment No. 1 shall be performed in accordance with the original base contract. With acceptance of this Amendment, the new Project Fee Base Estimate shall be increased to \$112,790.
