MINUTES OF THE CELEBRATION COMMITTEE MEETING HELD MAY 5, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 p.m.

Election of Chair:

Moved by Mayor Tutaj, seconded by Brian Drew to elect Kim Knaak as chair. Motion carried.

Parade:

Chair Knaak has created the Parade Application that will be available on-line and can be auto filled and emailed back to the Committee. The application is just updated from the one used last year. It will be emailed to past participants as well as being posted on the Celebrations Facebook page.

The parade will be at 2:00 p.m. with line-up starting at 1:00 p.m. Line-up will be at the same place as last year as well as using the same parade route.

Discussion was held on having an area designated in the park for a Car Show for the cars/motorcycles that participate in the parade.

Beverages (Beer and Soda):

Beer will be ordered similar to last year, the same with the soda. More water will be purchased as that seems to be the first item that runs out.

The Committee liked using tickets for the beer/soda/water purchases. Pricing will be beer/White Claw \$5.00 and soda/water will be \$1.00.

<u>Food – Food Trucks:</u>

Chair Knaak has a contact list of approximately 250 food trucks statewide. The ideal number would be 8 to 10 for the day of the event.

The application is ready to email out to all potential vendors. After discussion, it was agreed to charge the following fees for Food Trucks/Vendors:

Tent – 10x10 \$95.00 Food Truck \$150.00

Ice Cream:

After discussion with the Committee, it was decided to not do ice cream this year. Last year the Committee purchased popsicles and that seemed to work very well and was more cost effective. It was also discussed to price a small freezer for the Committee to use to store the popsicles in the day of the event.

Fireworks:

Mayor Tutaj stated that the City has budgeted \$7,000 for the annual fireworks. Because of using the park as the shoot off area, designated handicapped parking is needed as the parking lot cannot be used the day of the event.

Donations:

City Clerk/Treasurer Uecker will draft a donation letter for the Committee to review. She will also check to see if the City has a current, up-to-date business listing that can be used for donation letters.

Budget:

- Flags in the past, the flags have been ordered from Iroquois Bay. The Committee is going to look at ordering the flags directly from Eder Flags to see if they would be more cost effective.
- Glow Items it was discussed that most of the items that are in storage are from 2 years ago. The Committee felt that they should be thrown away and new items ordered for the 2022 celebration.
- Signage need to see what is in inventory and then decide what will need to be purchased for 2022.

Volunteers:

Mayor Tutaj stated that he would contact Thomas More to request student volunteers.

It was also discussed that Committee members should have a designated area that they would be the contact person for. It would eliminate a lot of confusion the day of the event and also help volunteers know who to go to for assistance, assignments, etc.
